Open Invention Network - Frederic Desbiens

Open Invention Network a standalone organization. Protection for patent and open source component registration. Stepping up efforts to defend the open source software.

If the tools can run on Linux then they can be included in the list. Packages submitted are checked by the legal team to see if they can be included. Updated every 18-24 months. Table 13 (revision 13) is closing fast.

Eclipse Theia or Che could be added to the list. Companies can also consider joining the OIN.

Jonas: Any argument for submitting all projects in the working group? Frederic: We do not want to flood the OIN with all the Eclipse projects.

Jonas: There are about 7 strategic projects the working group members are using.

Frederic: Then perhaps all 7 makes sense for the Eclipse Cloud Tools Group.

Need some clarity before taking steps with deployment, committer access lists and so on. Some concern over mistakes causing a large cloud bill. Technical measures on the cloud side should avoid this. Tricky when committers could have access to cause errors and high costs. Transfer will happen soon, we hope.

Modernization Strategic IG

Not only part of one working group. Joint venture between the Cloud Tools WG and IDE WG. Focus of this is toolchain modernization.
