Minute Taking

Thomas Froment opened the meeting and noted that attendance was lower than usual. Rob Moran announced that he is stepping down from the steering group to focus on other technologies. Joachim Krech, Director of MCU Tools at ARM, will become ARM's new representative, with Rob supporting the transition.

Tanja Obradovic introduced herself as the Eclipse Foundation lead for Java programmes and outlined her involvement across several working groups, including Cloud Developer Tools. Participants also shared their backgrounds and long-standing involvement in the Java and Eclipse ecosystems.

A discussion proposed by Tim deBoer on the growing importance of agentic development workflows, AI-assisted coding, and automated pull request reviews was postponed to a future meeting to allow for broader participation.

Tim also highlighted challenges Eclipse projects face when adopting AI-powered developer tools, particularly administrative and governance barriers. Thomas noted that this feedback aligns with ongoing efforts within the Eclipse Foundation to better support the adoption of AI technologies across projects.

Thomas presented an upcoming Agentic Workshop initiative focused on development workflows and engineering practices. The workshop builds on previous training activities and could serve as a model for similar events in other regions. <https://aieclipse.org/ai-workshop/>

An update was provided on the proposal to rename the Cloud Developer Tools Working Group to the Tool Builders Foundation. Feedback from Eclipse Foundation leadership has been positive, and participants discussed how the new name better conveys long-term stability, trust, and strategic positioning. There was also discussion around whether AI should be explicitly reflected in the branding or description.

Thomas shared updates on conference participation and invited members to provide news, releases, or project updates that could be highlighted during upcoming presentations and community engagements.

Finally, Thomas mentioned an ongoing request related to GitHub Copilot whitelisting, which remains under consideration by the EMO Team of the Eclipse Foundation.
